ABOUT LEADERSHIP TANGIPAHOA

The continued growth of Tangipahoa Parish signals a need for the development of trained, informed and responsible leadership.

Leadership Tangipahoa seeks out individuals who are interested in developing their skills as leaders, increasing their knowledge of our community, and learning what they can do to actively participate in community affairs. Through this program, participants develop a civic network and emerge with an increased knowledge of the diversities of our communities.

Leadership Tangipahoa addresses today's society. Individuals in the program participate in workshops designed to enhance their leadership skills, while educating them on various topics beneficial to their future roles as community leaders. Leadership Tangipahoa attracts candidates who bring a vision of the future and a sense of caring to the process of community development.

With commitment and understanding, graduates of Leadership Tangipahoa transfer skills learned to actual community application.

WHO IS LEADERSHIP TANGIPAHOA FOR?

Leadership is for any potential or existing leader whom resides or works in Tangipahoa Parish.

The following admission criteria has been established by Leadership Tangipahoa:

1. The participant shall be actively involved in the community.
2. The participant shall hold a position of management or equivalent and be identified to have the desire and ambition to move up in the organization.
3. The participant shall be dedicated and committed to Leadership and shall share the knowledge gained through leadership with all in their organization.
4. The participant shall hold a minimum of a High School Diploma.
5. The participant shall be able to meet the financial commitment.

HOW DOES LEADERSHIP TANGIPAHOA WORK?

Leadership Tangipahoa is associated with the Amite, Hammond, Independence, Kentwood and Ponchatoula Chambers of Commerce to assist in preparing participants for positions in local business, government and community affairs. The program is governed by the Board of Trustees with assistance from the local chambers.

The Leadership Tangipahoa experience consists of one weekend retreat and nine all-day sessions. Each session focuses on a specific aspect of Tangipahoa Parish, such as

- Government
- Culture and Tourism
- Community Health Care
- Leadership Competencies
- Economic Development
- Education
- Judicial System
- Understanding Diversity

Sessions include lectures, simulations, group discussions, panel presentations, field trips and community research projects.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS?

In addition to learning specific leadership skills and gaining a broad exposure to the community, participants also meet peers in other fields and form contacts that will benefit their volunteer and professional activities.



OATH COMMITMENT

To graduate from Leadership Tangipahoa, a participant is expected to attend all of the sessions. You will be given an annual calendar in advance with all dates.

- Orientation Weekend Retreat
Attendance is **MANDATORY** for this session
- Participating in at least two media events is mandatory
- One full weekday per month, September - May, and one additional weekend retreat.

No more than one absence is allowed and is strictly enforced.

IMPORTANT CONSIDERATIONS FOR EVERY APPLICANT

ATTENDANCE

In order to obtain the maximum benefit from Leadership Tangipahoa, a participant is expected to attend all the sessions. **No more than one absence is allowed if a participant is to graduate from Leadership Tangipahoa.** In order for the program to have meaning and be beneficial, this is strictly enforced.

RETREATS

The **orientation weekend retreat** is critical to the success of the Leadership Tangipahoa experience, therefore attendance for this session is **required** of every participant. The retreat will be your first Leadership Tangipahoa activity. Upon approval of your application, you will be notified regarding the location of the retreat.

SESSION SCHEDULES

Class sessions are held every third Tuesday of each month, 8 a.m.-5 p.m. Whenever there is an exception, participants will be notified in advance so that work schedules can be accommodated.

CLASS SIZE

The number of students in each yearly session may not exceed 20.

COST OF PROGRAM

The cost of the program is \$1,000.00. Tuition covers: fees, course materials, luncheons, socials, orientation retreat and group transportation when needed. Each participant is required to pay \$100 (personal check) and his/her employer or sponsor shall pay the remaining \$900.00. The \$100 (personal check) is required with the application form, and is **refundable only if not selected.**

There are a limited number of partial scholarships available for those who need assistance. We solicit sponsorships from area employers and ask that students attempt to solicit a sponsorship from their employer.
